WORKING FOR YOU!

THIS IS THE PARLIAMENT FOR YOUNG PEOPLE IN WALES.

Like the Senedd, the Welsh Youth Parliament will be made up of 60 Members.

You'll elect 40 Welsh Youth Parliament Members (WYPM) by voting in the election in November 2021. The remaining 20 will be elected by partner organisations. This makes sure we have representation from diverse groups of young people.

All 60 WYPM will have equal status with the same roles and responsibilities. If you are between 11 and up to 18 years old, living or receiving your education in Wales this is your opportunity to get involved by voting to elect WYPM or even standing as a candidate!

Your voice is powerful!

GET INVOLVED, HAVE YOUR SAY!

WELSH YOUTH PARLIAMENT MEMBERS WILL BE ELECTED FOR TWO YEARS.

During the two years the 60 WYPM will work together, looking at the issues that matter to you the most.

The Welsh Youth Parliament will:

- Empower Wales' young people to identify, raise awareness of and debate the issues important to you.
- Listen to young people in Wales, represent your views and act on the issues important to you.
- Work with key decision makers to raise these issues and call for change

REPRESENTING YOUR WALES!


YOU CAN USE YOUR VOTE TO DECIDE WHO REPRESENTS YOU AND YOUR PART OF WALES IN THE WELSH YOUTH PARLIAMENT.

Wales is broken down into 40 areas called constituencies

You can check which is your home or school/college constituency at www.senedd.wales/find-a-member-of-the-senedd/

This constituency is your part of Wales. When you vote, you're choosing the one person you want to represent you and your area. Once elected, the Welsh Youth Parliament Members will work together on a national level in the Senedd and will work in their local regions across Wales on issues raised by young people from across Wales.

HOW CAN I VOTE?

YOUR VOICE IS POWERFUL, MAKE SURE IT'S HEARD.

Anyone between 11 and up to the age of 18, living or receiving their education in Wales can vote in the WYP election

To register you will need to provide an e-mail address, post code and your date of birth. You can choose your home or school post code but remember to make sure it's the post code for the constituency you wish to cast your vote. If you registered to vote in our 2018 election you don't need to register again and you'll be e-mailed a voting code and instructions on 01 November 2021.

Voting for the election will open on 01 November and will close at 12pm on 22 November 2021.

To vote for your WYPM, you'll need to follow these 4 steps:



HOW DO I USE MY VOTE?

YOUR VOTE IS IMPORTANT, SO USE IT WISELY!

You will need to choose which candidate you wish to vote for. From 18 October 2021 you can visit www.youthparliament.wales to see who the candidates are.

As each constituency will have more than one person standing for election, you'll need to read their biographies and decide which one you think best represents how you think and feel about the issues you care about.

The candidates will be concentrating on issues that come under the responsibility of the Senedd, issues which affect your every day life like education, the environment and health. You can find out more about which issues are the responsibility of the Senedd by visiting www.sened.wales

The young person with the most votes will represent you and your constituency for a two year term.

Remember, once you have made your decision, you can't change it!
